As you will agree, this is a most unfortunate and alarming statistic. To address this crisis, the Police Chaplains and the Chicago Police Memorial Foundation will co-host an all-day **Police Suicide Awareness and Prevention Seminar** on Monday, 21 JAN, in Oak Brook. Two nationally-renowned speakers on this subject will be with us that day.

Invitations were sent to those involved in training police officers and candidates, Peer Support members, Employee Assistance Program counselors, supervisors, *et al*. We are inviting not only CPD members, but also colleagues from other jurisdictions (local, county, state and federal).
